Helping kingfishers, swifts and house martins

In the last newsletter we forgot to say that the kingfisher bank was also funded by Dulwich Community Council as part of the Cleaner, Greener, Safer scheme – our apologies. Many of you will have seen the kingfisher bank and perches from the walkway; it has recently been seeded so it will blend in with the surroundings. For swifts and house martins, it is hoped that some artificial nests will be installed on the Francis Peek Centre and the lodges. These birds are declining in the UK, so we want them to nest in the park.

100,000 bulbs planted

On a bitterly cold day in January, DPF volunteers planted the last of this season's 100,000 bulbs funded by the Cleaner, Greener, Safer scheme. If you have been to the park recently, you will have seen the glorious displays of colour. The crocuses around the College Gate entrance were particularly spectacular.

At last year's fair, children were involved in creating an a beautiful mosaic in the shape of a lizard for the park's dry garden (adjacent to the café). It is hoped that Southwark's small works team will be able to install the mosaic in time for this year's fair on 17 May.

Jolly boating weather?

The good news is that four operators are interested in offering boating on the lake. The council is assessing the applications and hopes to announce the operator by 30 April, in time for this year's boating season.

The lodges

The council's programme of works indicates that work will start on refurbishing the exterior of College Lodge this September, although no announcement has been made about a potential tenant. The future of Rosebery Lodge is still undecided, but the back garden is now being transformed into a model allotment for the park.

Schools programme

As you know, DPF has been pressing the council to make use of the Francis Peek Centre for natural history education and conservation projects for local schools. We are pleased that the council has appointed the London Wildlife Trust (LWT) to provide a pilot scheme of ten sessions this coming summer term.

Model allotment

DPF is supporting Dulwich Going Greener in making a model allotment in the park, in the back garden of Rosebery Lodge. Allotment volunteers have recently joined our Dig the Park events



to clear the overgrown plot. To support invertebrates, birds and other wildlife, a substantial 'dead hedge' has been created from the undergrowth which has been cut down. Stag beetle larvae discovered during the clearing work have been carefully moved into the dead hedge. The allotment still needs more volunteers;
